grace as a wellspring of strength, comfort, and wisdom and grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and

Savior Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18). He gave your gifts from above (James 1:17) so I declare you will discover more of your talents, cultivate them, and use them to glorify God and bless others.

Allow it to drive your actions, bringing comfort, mercy, and love to those in need. And as you minister to others, remember that you are also blessed with unique spiritual gifts to build up the body of Christ.
